### MY STORY

I have been pushed around to different relatives and families my whole life because my dad died when I was 2 and my mom has been absent from my life since I was 3. I also faced the responsibility of being the eldest of 8 and needing to set a good example.

As a teenager, I became very troubled as I learned more about who my parents were and what happened to them. I reluctantly attended a Christian camp in high school and, to my surprise, when I heard the speaker ask, "Who wants to be God's hands and feet in their community?" I found myself at the front of the room sobbing and committing my life to Christ. After that I became very inquisitive about the Bible and sought out people and resources to learn more about God.

One heart breaking thing about my community is fathers not fulfilling their roles, which leaves kids vulnerable to gangsterism, drug and alcohol abuse and sexual immorality. I started leading mentoring programs at local schools with teenage boys in response to this issue and have seen that through my experience of not having a dad in my life I am able to encourage these boys. I would like to be able to guide young men to become better than what statistics and the community claim they will become.

I've learned a lot from the East Mountain community: People from all walks of life have a common goal of serving. No matter what our perspective is on all the topics we cover, we respect each other's voices.

I like spending most of my time outdoors, connecting with God in nature, and going camping and hiking.


### MY STORY
